c) Manner of execution and fund disbursement

- CSR Budget is fixed in accordance with the provisions of Section 135 of Companies Act, 2013, read with relevant rules.
- Implementation mode: NGO's registered as a Society or Public charitable trusts or Section 8 Companies and having CSR Registration with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs whose vision is in alignment with any of the focus areas or activities under Schedule VII.
- Once the NGOs are identified, a due diligence process is initiated to evaluate the organization's operations and statutory compliances before making any decisions.
- The Company prepares a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that clearly defines the objectives and timelines between the Company and the executing partner.
- Funds get disbursed in one or more tranches depending upon the nature of the project.
- Utilisation of funds gets certified by a practicing Chartered Accountant and is submitted to Orbis for our satisfactory due diligence.

d) Monitoring and reporting mechanism for the programmes

The monitoring mechanism includes periodic reviews between the Company and the implementing agency as per the objectives and deliverables of respective projects. The CSR Committee of the Company and its Board is responsible for review ensuring operational efficiency and control.
